23 août 2019 – Dans un rapport intitulé “SOS Enfants”, l'agence des Nations Unies pour les droits de l'enfant (Unicef) revient sur la situation des dizaines de milliers d'enfants restés à la maison en Afrique de l'Ouest et du Centrale. Dans son rapport, l'Unicef fait savoir qu'en juin 2019, environ 1,91 million d'enfants étaient privés d'éducation en raison de la violence et de l'insécurité au sein et aux abords des écoles.

Global – UN Security Council Summoned to Protect Children in Conflict

27th August 2019 – More than 80 UN Member States expressed concern about the effects on children of ongoing conflicts, and discussed efforts needed to address these children's needs, with many supporting enhanced efforts for their reintegration in society. The UN Security Council held an open debate on children and armed conflict and considered a report of the UN Secretary-General on the topic.

16th August 2019 – LAST year was the worst year since records began for the number of children killed or injured in armed conflict, the United Nations has revealed: 12,000 children were maimed or killed in 20 different conflicts around the world.

5th August 2019 – Annual U.N. report on Children in Armed Conflict calls to investigate the deaths of Palestinian children in 2018, but doesn't explicitly condemn Israel. Palestinian U.N. envoy: omission "undercuts efforts to put an end to the criminal violations against children around the world."

Mali – Mali witnesses a 'disturbing' rise in child deaths and injuries due to conflict, Unicef warns

13th August 2019 – The number of children in Mali killed or maimed due to conflict has skyrocketed so far this year, a Unicef report has warned. In the first six months of 2018, 35 children died as a result of violence in the west African nation. But in 2019 this figure rose to 154 – an increase of more than 330 per cent.

Myanmar – Protections for children in armed conflicts submitted to parliament

30th August 2019 – U Kyaw Tin, Union minister of International Cooperation, submitted the Optional Protocol to the Convention on the Rights of the Child to the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw (Assembly of the Union) on Wednesday. "The objective of the protocol is to protect children from being recruited and used in armed conflicts. It is a very important international protocol in protecting children's rights," he said.

Venezuela – Venezuelan refugees recruited as child soldiers in Colombia: Report

8th August 2019 – As Venezuelans flee their country in search of safety and economic security, another set of dangers awaits them across the border. In Colombia's northeast, where many Venezuelans have ended up, rival armed groups control illegal border crossings and wreak havoc on civilians with killings, intimidation, sexual violence and recruit children as soldiers, according to a new report by NGO Human Rights Watch.
