RULES OF THE FUNDRAISING AUCTION International Bureau for Children's Rights (IBCR)

Terms of participation

Anyone wishing to bid must be 18 years of age or older and must complete the registration form at the registration table before the start of the auction. The registration form may also be printed and completed in advance and must be personally hand-delivered on the day of the auction. By registering, you certify that you have read and understood the auction rules and agree to abide by them.

Procedure

- 1. The auction will take place at Galerie 203, 227 Notre-Dame Street West, Montreal on Thursday, October 21st, starting at 7:00 p.m., in the form of a silent and live auction.
- 2. All artworks are subject to a minimum reserve price below which the prize will not be sold.
- 3. As part of the silent auction, an auction sheet for each artwork will be available. Those wishing to participate must enter their full name, telephone number and bid. Each new bid must be entered on the line following the previous bid. The auction sheet must not be removed under any circumstances and only the person in charge of the auction may cancel a bid for reasons of non-compliance. The entry of a bid on the auction sheet of a work is considered as a binding contract of purchase of the work in the event that this bid wins the auction.

Allocation of the prize

- The prize will be allocated to the highest bidder at the closing of the auction, who will have to go to the Payment Table to pay with a credit card (MasterCard or Visa) or cash before the end of the evening.
- An invoice will be issued on site and must be paid the same evening in cash or by credit card. The ownership
 title to the offered lot will then be transferred to you, and you therefore accept all risks and full
 responsibility for the work you have purchased.
- All sales are final. All goods subject to this auction are sold as exhibited. No purchase can be returned, refunded or exchanged.
- If the final purchase price is equal to or greater than 125% of the estimated value, a charity tax receipt will be issued to the purchaser for the difference between the estimated value and the sale price.
- The IBCR staff and administrators may acquire goods. These purchases are made on a strictly personal basis.

Prize collection

- Buyers must collect the artworks at the end of the evening of the sale or pick them up the next day at the Gallery on appointment, both options upon presentation of a proof of payment.
- Transport can be arranged at the buyer's expense. The IBCR is not responsible for the actions of the carriers
 or packers of the purchased goods. The packaging and handling of purchased goods is at the risk of the
 buyer.
- By taking part in the auction, all participants waive all liability to the employees, managers, administrators and volunteers of the IBCR, as well as to the artist who donated the work, for any damage, prejudice or loss that they may suffer as a result of their participation, acceptance and use of the work.
