Afghanistan - Afghanistan: An Additional 1.5 Million Children Need Help to Survive in 2020, warns Save the Children

18th February 2020 - The number of children in Afghanistan who will need humanitarian assistance in 2020 has jumped by 40 percent compared to last year, warns Save the Children[i], meaning an extra 1.5 million children need support to survive

Global - Children are Bearing the Bitter Brunt of Counter-Terrorism Efforts: Report

5th February 2020 - Counter-terrorism efforts adopted by governments around the world in response to threats of terrorism are affecting children negatively in numerous ways, a report by Watchlist on Children and Armed Conflict (Watchlist) claimed last week. The policy note claimed a lot of these counter-terrorism measures "lack adequate safeguards for children" and lose sight of how they're detrimental to children against the bigger picture of fighting terror threats.

Global - UN chief: 250 million children in conflict-affected nations

13th February 2020 - Some 250 million children live in countries affected by conflict, Secretary-General Antonio Guterres told the U.N. Security Council on Wednesday. And he said 2018 saw more than 12,000 children killed or injured as a result of those conflicts, the highest number since



1996. Speaking on the International Day against the Use of Child Soldiers, the U.N. chief said children below age 18 "constitute more than 50% of the population of most countries affected by war, and are among the most vulnerable, unable to protect themselves from its impact."

Syria - Investigation a Crucial Tool for Preventing Child Rights Violations in Armed Conflicts

11th February 2020 - There has been a disturbing increase in violence perpetrated against children in conflicts worldwide, coupled with almost total impunity. A crucial step towards stemming this deplorable trend is to strengthen accountability for child rights violations and to deter would-be



perpetrators. This requires specialized child rights investigations, established and backed by the international community.
